Peanut Butter Nebula Cookies

With Four Simple Ingredients

Ingredients:

- 1 Cup of peanut butter (smooth/creamy)
- 1 Cup light brown sugar
- l egg
- ½ Teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions:

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Line baking sheets with parchment paper.

Step 2

Combine the peanut butter, brown sugar, vanilla extract, and egg. Mix until smooth.

Step 3

Drop spoonfuls of dough onto the prepared baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 6 to 8 minutes. Lightly press down in a crisscross pattern with a fork.

Step 4

Take rack out and let cookies cool for several mutes before transferring to a wire cooling rack.

NOTE:

Be careful not to overbake these, you will want slightly brown bottoms. These cookies often 'harden' when they cool. Also, the peanut butter is often like molten lava when the cookies immediately come out of the oven...don't try to move them onto a cooling rack until they have cooled and set up. You will risk second degree burns (I have experience).
